Departmental Advisory Boards – Each Department will establish its own Board, focusing on the relevance of curricula to labour market trends, fostering entrepreneurship, and strengthening sector-specific collaborations. While the Branch currently lacks its own faculty or staff, the stakeholders involved in developing the quality policy have been those of NKUA.
