More specifically, the home department is committed to properly provisioning the branch from its first days of operations in a fashion that is planned, coherent and offers continuity in teaching and research so that the phasing in of students is as seamless as possible. From the beginning and in proportion to the number of students recruited so that they are properly supported, the branch is organized to have: Five (5) teaching staff working full-time across fields of knowledge and with complementing expertise in teaching and administrative duties. One (1) special teaching-staff fully focused in developing and maintaining processes and quality of provision. We are also paying plans for up to five visiting professors and one or two special scientists to help with knowledge exchange and mentoring of the branch staff in maintaining the level of provision at the standards of the parent department.
